Key Policy Updates

Significant edits

- **Policies 2.5 & 2.6:** Emphasize collaboration with transit providers.
- **Policies 2.7 & 2.8:** Consolidate bicycle-related policies to eliminate duplication.
- **Policy 3.5:** Added parking management as a Transportation Demand Management measure.
- **Policy 4.8:** Streamlined benefits/burdens policy.
- **Policy 6.1:** Added “workers” to the list of considerations for mobility.

New (or mostly new) policies

- **Policy 3.3:** Clarified prior policy on Mode Shift. (Discussed in a moment.)
- **Policy 3.4:** Reworded short trip policy to emphasize choice rather than prioritization of one mode over another.
- **Policy 4.6:** Clarified prior out-of-direction policy to emphasize connectivity and redundancy.
- **Policy 6.3:** New policy to collaborate with local and regional freight users to understand needs.
- **Policy 6.5:** New policy to assert the City’s relationship with the region.
